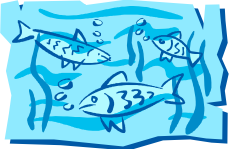




Lister's Notice:

The preliminary version of the 2009 Grand List will soon be lodged with the Town Clerk and opened to public inspection at the Town Offices. The date of lodging, which will be no later than June 4th, will be posted on the town bulletin boards around town. About 15% of properties in Corinth will change in value, and affected property owners will be receiving individual change of appraisal notices shortly after the Grand List is lodged. Any property owner may appeal his or her assessment, but this must be done no later than 14 days after the Grand List is lodged.

Blake Memorial Library News

The spring book and plant sale will take place at the library on Saturday, May 23 from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. As always, we welcome your book donations. As the kids outgrow their childhood favorites, and as you try to open up some shelf space this spring, keep us in mind. Donating books to the library helps us build our collection, helps us raise important funds, and promotes the circulation of books throughout the community.

On Wednesday, May 27 at 4:30, as a part of the National Endowment for the Arts' "Big Read" initiative, we'll be hosting the first of two discussions of Ray Bradbury's classic novel *Fahrenheit 451*. The second meeting will be held two weeks later on Wednesday, June 10 at 4:30. Copies of the book, made available by the Vermont Arts Council, the Brownell Library, and the Vermont Community Foundation, are currently available at the Blake Memorial Library.

On Friday, June 3 at 7:00 p.m., Ann McKinstry Micou, the author of three books chronicling the history of fiction set in Vermont, will speak at the library.

Summer reading will begin with an information session at 2:00 on Friday, June 19, followed by regularly scheduled meeting times set aside for five different age groups. Story time will continue throughout the summer at 10:00 on Thursday mornings for toddlers, preschoolers, and slightly older kids. Grades 1-3 will meet on select Mondays from 2 to 3, grades 4-6 will meet on select Wednesdays from 2-3, grades 7-8 will meet on select Fridays from 2-3, and grades 9-12 will meet on select Mondays. The meeting days and times are posted on the calendar on our website (www.blakememorial.org). To start things off with some inspiration, a summer reading kickoff program for kids of all ages (and for adults of course, too) will be held at 3:00 on Saturday, June 27 featuring Simon Brooks, a professional storyteller who will both spin some yarns and invite us to exercise our own imaginations and develop our own tall tales.

Another reason to mark your calendars for Saturday, June 27th is the third annual Secret Garden Tour, which will commence at noon and run until 5:00 (rain or shine!). Five new gardens will be open that afternoon for the benefit of the library, and refreshments will be available all afternoon on the library lawn. Tickets are \$15 in advance; \$20 on the day of the tour.

Of course, other films will be shown over the course of the next few months, poetry night will continue on the fourth Wednesday of every month at 7:00, knitting night will continue on the second Monday of every month at 6:30.

Tax Bill Information from the Treasurers Office

Reminder – If you purchased property after April 1, 2009 the 2009-2010-tax bill will be mailed to the owner of record as of April 1, 2009 in accordance with 32 VSA § 3651 noted in part below.

“4. Time of ownership. Under this section, April 1 of each year is the date for determining record ownership of taxable real property in the town. In re Summit Ventures, Inc., 135E.R. 483 (Bankr. D. Vt. 1991)...

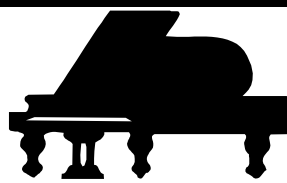
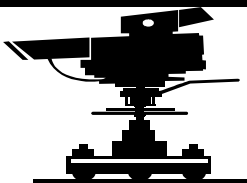
Last owner of real estate on the first day of April in any year continued liable for taxes legally assessed thereon in that year regardless of subsequent conveyances: *Fulton v. Aldrich* (1904) 76 Vt. 310, 57 A. 108.”

If you are a new owner after April 1st, please call the Treasurer's Office to request a copy of the tax bill.

The new tax rate for the 2009-2010 tax year will be set early to mid July. Tax bills should be mailed not later than July 30th. It is the responsibility of the property owner to advise and provide tax information to their tax service and/or escrow account.

Be sure to check your tax bill for correctness – including name's, address, acreage, valuation, education tax classification, etc. If you are a Corinth resident that owned and occupied a Vermont homestead on April 1, 2009 you are required by law to file the Homestead Declaration (form HS-122) with the Vermont Department of Taxes. Your education rate on your tax bill will be classified and billed at the "Homestead Education" tax rate. However, if you have filed the Homestead Declaration form HS-122 and your education rate is billed as "Non Residential Education" you need to call the Vermont Department of Taxes (802-828-2505) to resolve the classification issue or you need to file the Homestead Declaration form as required by law. You can late file the HS-122 form up to September 1, 2009 but late filing penalties will apply.

2009-2010 is the current year. All tax years prior to 2009-2010 are delinquent. If you owe taxes for current year and delinquent tax years do NOT combine payment for current and delinquent years – separate checks are required.
