**Music & talent committee formed:**

At the last historical society meeting a music and talent committee was formed. It is our hope that in doing so we can accomplish several objectives at the same time. One would be to bring our community and other community talent & audiences together on a regular basis starting during the summer café season and then at the town hall and other local places at least once a month. The other would be our hope to use these events to fill the void in the much needed fund raising department for our organization and the third would be so that we can have a good time!

We envision several venues to include performers at our Academy Cafés, coffee house style family oriented events at our town hall with food and drink available, and events at other locations in town that suit the scheduled performances.

The members of the committee met at the town hall recently to test and troubleshoot its acoustical aspects. We discovered that with the right electrical equipment along with setting up the performers over by the voting booths and hanging quilts on the walls that we should be able to make the sound work much better for us in the hall.

We noted that insulating shades and/or curtains would help a great deal as well as saving on energy. The CHS and the town, as non profits, will qualify for a grant down the road for such an expense that could include electrical and additional lighting work that would improve the hall for performances.

The Cultural Facilities Grant issued by the State is a 50/50% matching grant with a 25% in kind allowance. That means we could do the labor related to shade, curtain and possibly acoustic wall panel installation as part of the 25%. If all worked out right, we would only have to come up with 25% of the cost for the project.

The committee members are Norm Collette, Connie Longo, Dave Richard, Tony & Teddy Mason.

Dave has been very active and enthusiastic and is working hard to book musicians for our events. He and his friend Gill Williams started off the season of Cafés on the 3rd of July and brought in a good crowd who had a good time and some of them even got to dancing! And to sweeten the deal, we brought in about \$60.00 that day, twice what we normally do on the average Café Saturday.

On July 10th, Tony Mason, Corinth's "Red Hot Blues/One Man Band", will perform for the Corinth Academy event in Cookeville.

Tony & Teddy have been a big help in figuring out the acoustic problems at the hall and are a pleasure to work with.

Ricker Winsor of Bradford will be performing at the Academy Café in Cookeville on July 24th. Rick plays various finger picking styles including old blues tunes.

On August 14th Roots Music will be performed by Dave Richard, Keith & Kathy Friedland and Fran Damato, all of Corinth.
